Child Abuse Awareness Training Available Free Of Charge

With summer rapidly approaching, many congregations will be offering a variety of activities for children and youth such as Vacation Bible School, mission trips, summer day camps, etc. The diocese is pleased to announce the availability of **Safeguarding Online** internet-based child abuse awareness training, which is free of charge and can be completed online in about 1-1/2 hours. As you plan your congregational activities, we commend to you this training program for all adults who are working with children and youth. This would include adults who are participating with youth on mission trips and pilgrimages.

It can be hard to broach the topic of child abuse or sexual misconduct with your congregation. It's an uncomfortable subject, but it's critical to educate church employees and volunteers about child sexual misconduct and prevention. Prevention is the best way to ensure a secure community.

Let us remember that we are called to receive, nurture and treasure each child as a gift from God. As a diocese with its congregations, schools, programs and many activities, we are called to provide a safe and nurturing environment for our children and youth to learn and grow in the love of Jesus Christ. To that end, we are committed to making every effort to keep our children and youth safe from sexual abuse.

If you would like to take advantage of this resource, the leadership of the congregation needs to identify someone who would serve as the administrator/registrar for this program. It is very easy to register people and compliance can be monitored simply by going online. Many congregations are already providing this training for their volunteers and congregational leadership.

Emerson pitcher drafted by Dodgers

Emerson senior David Palladino, the most dominant pitcher in North Jersey this season, was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers on Tuesday in the 13th round of Major League Baseball's first year player draft.

Scouts were flocking to see the 6-foot-8 right-hander all spring, and his fastball was clocked at 93 mph during the [Bergen County](#) tournament.

"I'm pretty excited," Palladino said. "I didn't expect it to be the Dodgers. I thought other teams showed more interest."

Palladino, who is in the running for North Jersey Player of the Year honors, was 10-1 with three no-hitters and a 1.08 ERA. In 72 innings pitched, he struck out 131 and allowed 19 hits.

"The Dodgers said they liked my potential with my height," said Palladino, who is not concerned about the Dodgers' financial woes. "They like my mechanics and everything."

He is scheduled to attend Division I South Carolina-Upstate.

Congregational Vitality Fund

From the Diocese of Newark



Program Purpose

To provide congregational vitality funds for the support, strengthening, development and renewal of our congregations' **mission** and **ministry**. The Board seeks to challenge and support our congregations as they prayerfully reflect on how their existing and future projects and programs might deepen and strengthen congregational life.

Mission – that vocation to which the congregation believes it has been called.

Ministry – how the mission to whom God has called the congregation is being lived out.

Demonstrated Showing

A congregation will be required to demonstrate that the grant will be used in furtherance of a specific

developmental or renewal goal as it seeks to define and carry out its mission.

Grant Proposals Sought

The Board will seek proposals which include strategies and measurable goals that address these possible areas of congregational vitality:

- Radical Hospitality/Welcome
- Clergy and Lay Leadership Development
- Stewardship and Financial Stability
- Evangelism
- Spiritual Formation: Christian Identity, Discipleship, Ministry Gifts Discernment
- Liturgy and Worship
- Visioning/Strategic Planning
- Collaborative ministries between congregations

Grant Awards

Although most grants are expected to be between \$2000 and \$5000, larger awards may be granted where an exceptional congregational project is presented.

Grant Duration

Grants will be awarded for a period of one year. All grantees are expected to submit a written evaluation report at the end of the grant period. See, Evaluation Report attached to this application. Future grants from this Fund and from other Diocesan loans and grants fund are conditioned upon receipt of this report.

If grant funds are not disbursed within one year of the grant award, a written request for an extension must be submitted to the Board.

Application Cycle

The Board will receive and consider on an annual basis grant applications from congregations throughout the Diocese of Newark.

Deadline: August 15

The monthly newsletter is a joint effort by all members of the congregation. It's a place to get updates and share things that are happening that are important to us.
